Dear Members,


The past few months have been very trying with the impacts of fires and the ongoing drought. Members across the State have been on high alert ready to enact their fire survival plans, many have had to evacuate themselves and their animals to local showgrounds, and sadly we know that one member's property was burnt but thankful they and their sheep are ok. Thank you to those who have helped with the response, either on a fire truck, in other support roles or have donated. Sadly this fire season is far from over.

Feed costs are continuing to rise, putting pressure on member's finances. Members are also considering the health of their pastures and available water resources. Many members have made the difficult decision to significantly reduce their stock numbers or indeed sell entire flocks. This comes at a great personal toll having to make these difficult decisions. Personal health and family circumstances come into these decisions as well.

While the world looks bleak and smoky right now and I'm feeling very sad, please hold onto hope for the future. We are a collective group of people passionate about coloured sheep and wool. I'm looking forward to seeing Black & Coloured Sheep as "feature breed" at the Royal Canberra Show 28-29 Feb - 1 March and hosting the National Fleece Competition at the same show. There are potential structural changes to our Association at the upcoming AGM on 15 February and long-standing committee members standing down.

Please consider taking on a role to support our Association. Our network has been valuable in supporting one another through these difficult times.

PROPOSAL TO MERGE REGIONS

The case for a two region model was written by Eric Barry and the state only model was written by Lynda Jennings.

TWO REGION MODEL

This proposal would merge Central and Northern Tablelands with Hawkesbury into a Northern Region and South Coast and Southern Tablelands with Monaro/South West Slopes into a Southern Region.

The reasons are as follows:

- It is more convenient to hold meetings in a central location for each region.
- Most of our members are aging, either retired or nearing retirement. It is tiring to travel long distances and quite expensive due to food, fuel and accommodation costs.
- Traditionally the Central Tablelands, Northern Region and Hawkesbury regions have supported a value added/craft based outlook on the coloured sheep and wool products and the promotion of coloured sheep at markets and field days rather than the showing of sheep for competition.
- Finances could be more easily managed by a treasurer in each region who understands the local region/market and drivers.
- I believe a single region would make it difficult to recruit new members if they have to travel a long way. It is hard enough getting existing members to support and be involved in our current model.

ONLY STATE AND NO REGIONAL GROUPS

This proposal would see no regional groups only the state organisation.

The reasons are as follows:

• The organisation currently has 51 members, out of these 51, we have the following position holders:

- 36 positions between 51 members, with many members not active or attending meetings most positions are divided between a smaller group of people who hold a number of positions.
- The organisation currently has 5 bank accounts, with the State sending money to the regions based on member numbers and the regions sending money to the State to pay show sponsorships, ribbons etc. Each of the regional accounts have to be reconciled and sent to the Treasurer annually with delays. For such a small organisation to have 5 accounts seems ridiculous, when it means effectively as an organisation we do not know how much money we have.
- As the membership ages finding position holders, as well as attending 8 meetings a year becomes harder. By only having state meetings we only need to resource 1 committee and attend 4 meetings a year.
- With the current regional models there is no clear focus on the goals of the organisation, each
 region determines show sponsorship with no cohesive policy on how much should be donated in
 prize money. There seems to be little or no cohesive policy on marketing. Little or no cohesive
 policy on educating people in relation to coloured sheep.

 While it is likely that meetings will be longer with just the State model, the State meetings are becoming longer, but it is an opportunity to start the meetings .before lunch and increase the time to socialise. For many members the social aspect of the organisation is the main reason for attending meetings.

• The constitution allows for the formation of sub-groups, such as the recent National Fleece Competition sub-group. We could form sub-groups aligned with goals such as shows or events such as Robertson and/or Mudgee Small Farm Field Days.



President's Report:

The drought continues to worsen across the state. Driving up from Young, the Mudgee region is a lot worse in conditions than at home. The rain clouds are coming over as we speak, so here's hoping we get some rain this afternoon that is wide spread. Hand-feeding stock is increasing becoming more expensive and we are also seeing a decline in coloured sheep numbers as many stock have had to be sold or ewes aren't being joined due to the dry conditions.
