Delivered at the State meeting held 24th November 2012 at the Goulburn Soldiers' Club.

Central Tablelands

It was only six months ago that we were complaining about all the heavy rain and the damage caused to crops and paddocks. Now we are complaining about the dry weather and lack of feed as we move towards summer, having had a drier than normal spring. Still that's life on the land.

2012 is drawing to a close and all our markets and field days are finished. For the Central Region, this year has been quite successful and we have finished up with more money in the bank than when we started, thanks mainly to a very successful Wool Muster.

In July we attended the Mudgee Small Farm Field days with good success despite the muddy conditions.

Crowd numbers were down but sales were up on last year.

In August we went to the Mudgee Food and Wine Fair at Balmoral beach. Unfortunately the weather was not kind and the cold and windy conditions kept crowd numbers down. We did however manage to sell more beanies and scarves than any other event during the year.

We linked with Kurrajong Spinners to add to the activities including carding and weaving.

Sales were disappointing. We certainly had a very enjoyable time together as a group and I personally was very proud.

We are planning a baling day for members' unsold wool, the good news being that we have been offered the use of our local Alpaca Association's electric press.

The weather has been interesting with the first four months of the year being way over the long term averages and the last four being way below, bringing the total year to date at just on the average. Temperatures have been remarkably even with very little frost.

Last year at shearing, many fleeces were water affected but this year they grew on well from well watered pasture without the frequent soakings.

Pity this is not the NFC year!

Lambing had its highs and lows but I'm sure there will be more again next year.

We are looking forward to a good standard of exhibits of both fleeces and sheep at next year's Castle Hill and Hawkesbury shows.

In November we hosted the Black and Coloured fleece and sheep classes at the Queanbeyan Show. Ten fleeces from six exhibitors (two of whom are not members) were judged by Nigel Baines from Monaro Wools (a subsidiary companyof SBBL). He awarded the Supreme Champion fleece to Ciel and Donna Georgievski who were first time fleece exhibitors.

The sheep steward telephoned me a couple of days before the event in a real panic. Four judges had been approached prior to me, but all either pulled out or were unavailable. The steward knew that I am uncomfortable judging the same event two years running, but he had run out of options. I judged 15 sheep from three exhibitors and South Coast and Southern Tablelands Region's Picton High School took out the Supreme Exhibit.

November was also when our region was visited by Jacalyn Post, a coloured wool enthusiast from northern California. She was touring both NSW and Victoria, seeing what we got up to with our Australian sheep and fleeces.
